## Urine sample collection

- 1. Drop off your fresh urine sample within one hour of collection. If this is not possible, please put in the fridge and drop off asap.
- 2. Use a clean non-contaminated container (e.g. a tupperware box) to collect the urine (free urine sample collection/storage containers are available from our practice).
- 3. Collect as much urine as possible.
- 4. Label the storage container with your surname, your pet's name, collection date and time.
- 5. **Dogs**: Whenever possible, get a clean free-catch sample rather than from the floor as the latter may contaminate the urine.
- 6. **<u>Cats</u>**: use Katkor (non-absorbent cat litter; can be purchased from us) or no litter and clean litter tray.
- 7. If you have multiple cats that use the same litter tray, separate the patient from other pets in house to collect the sample.
- 8. There is a fee to run urine samples. Please pay when you drop off the sample.
